Benny Goodman 100th Anniversary Exhibit



This fall the Music Library marks the centenary of Benny Goodman (1909-1986) with an exhibit featuring big band arrangements, concertos by Hindemith and Copland, photographs, and a wide variety of other materials, such as Goodman's honorary doctorate from Yale, a program and ticket from his famous Carnegie Hall concert in 1938, and a letter from fellow clarinetist Woody Allen.
